

Mrs. Rose Jackson Dies Near Freetown

Mrs. Rose Jackson, age eighty-feur, a life-long resident of Jackson county, died early Monday morning at her home on a Freetown rural route, about two miles south of Freetown on State Road-135, following a critical illness of about a week's duration. She had been in failing health for about twelve years.

Mrs. Jackson was born on December 2, 1859, in this county, the daughter of James and Minerva Allen, both of whom preceded her in death. On August 4, 1886, she was married, also in this county, to Sherman Jackson, who survives.
