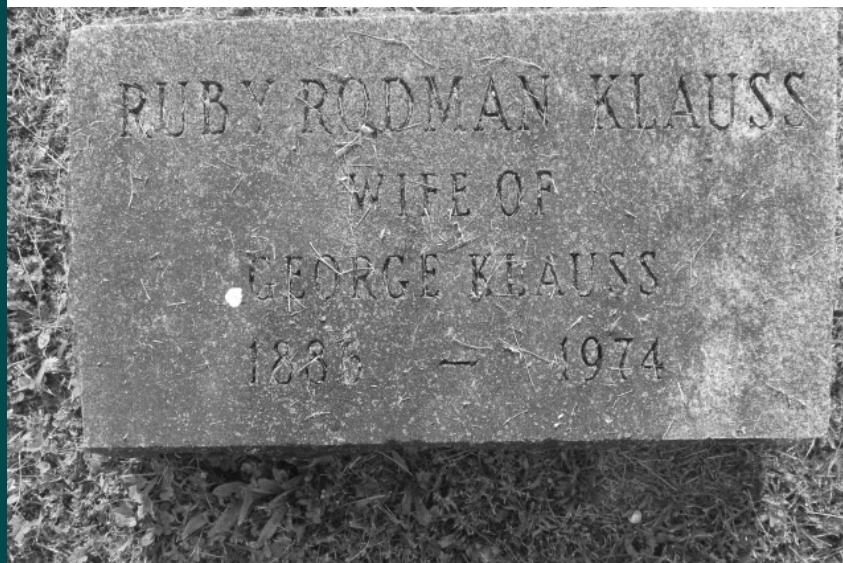

Mrs. Mockford Dies, Rites Set Saturday

Mrs. Ruby Mockford, 87, of Dexter, Mo., a former Brownstown resident, died at 6:30 p. m. Wednesday at Dexter Memorial Hospital.

A long-time Brownstown resident, she had also lived 30 years in Mississippi and one year in Dexter.

She was a former school teacher and was a member of the United Methodist Church.

Born Nov. 1, 1886, in Brownstown, she was the daughter of the late William and Frankie Cowling Rodman.
