KLEWITZ—Louis Klewitz, who was stricken with paralysis, mention of which was made last week, died at his home in Brownstown, Sunday evening, March 30, 1907, aged 78 years, one month and 14 days. Deceased was born in Quodlenburg, Germany, February 7, 1829. He came to this country August 7, 1854, settling at Cincinnati, and in the fall of 1855 located in Jackson county, where he followed farming and by his thrift and energy soon became recognized as one of Brownstown township's most substantial farmers. In June, 1899, he left the farm and moved to town, where he has since resided. He was united in marriage in February, 1856, to Catherine Garris. To their union were born seven daughters, two of whom—Minnie and Mrs. Anna Lucas—with their mother survive him. He also leaves one brother in Germany. Mr. Klewitz was one of Jackson county's highly respected German citizens and had a host of friends and acquaintances over the county. The funeral services which were largely attended, were conducted at the Lutherns, church of which he was a member, Rev. Schumn officiating, in both English and German after which the remains were laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.
