Former Teacher Dies Sunday

Mrs. Laura T. Lucas, 82, Passes Away At Home Of Son, A. L. Lucas, Brownstown.

Mrs. Laura T. Lucas passed away at the home of her son, Allan L. Lucas, in Brownstown Sunday morning April 20, 1941, age 82 years and 16 days.— She had been in failing health for several months.

Funeral services were conducted at the Methodist church Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock in charge of the pastor, the Rev. Frank Templin. Burial in Fairview cemetery.

Laura T. Long was the last surviving member of a family of seven children born to the late Daniel H. and Sarah Ross Long, natives of Kentucky. She was born in Brownstown April 14, 1859. On June 30, 1881, she was married to James Lee Lucas, who died January 14, 1888. To their union were born two children, Allan L. Lucas, of Brownstown, and Mrs. Laura Woodring, of Columbus, Ohio, who survive. She spent most of her life in Brownstown. Her early married life was spent in Niles, Midhigan and Chicago.
