LONG—Mrs. Sarah A. Long, whose illness has been mentioned from time to time, breathed her last Saturday night, February 19, 1906, about 11:30 o'clock, aged 84 years, 4 months and 3 days. Her maiden name was Sarah A. Ross and she was born in Oldham county, Ky., October 7, 1821. She was united in marriage October 8, 1833, to Daniel H. Long, who was one of the most prominent men and able attorneys in the county in his day. He was in the newspaper business in Brownstown several years, served as county clerk from 1855 to 1864, and represented this, with other counties, in the legislature from 1866 to 1876. He died June 29, 1876. They moved from Charlestown to Brownstown in August, 1844. To their union were born ten children, five of whom are now living, viz: Capt. B. E. Long and Mrs. Laura T. Lucas, of Brownstown; Mrs. Ma Hans, of Zionsville; Mrs. Emma Kyle, of Wisconsin, and Ross Long, of Pendleton.

Mrs. Long was one of Brownstown's best known and highly esteemed ladies. She united with the Presbyterian church August 15, 1875 and remained a consistent member of the church and a trusted and devoted child of God to the day of her death. While she saw much in life to live for, yet she realized that death was not far off and calmly made her funeral arrangements. She was a devoted wife, a tender and loving mother, and a kind neighbor one whose kind treatment of all won her the esteem and respect of a host of friends.

Private funeral services were held at the family residence in Brownstown, Tuesday, February 13. Rev. J. H. Weaver, of the Presbyterian church, assisted by Rev. T. W. Northcott, officiating, after which the remains were laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.
