

Obituary-Mrs. Kittie Lubker.

Mrs. Kittie Lubker, whose death occurred Wednesday evening, January 23rd, 1884, was born near Brownstown on the 4th day of September, 1855. When 15 years of age, she connected herself with the Church of Christ, and remained a faithful member until her death. On the 12th day of September, 1875, she was united in marriage with David H. Lubker. Three children were born to them, the oldest of whom is about 6 years of age and the youngest about 2 years. Nearly two years ago Mrs. Lubker became a member of Laura Lodge, No. 166, Daughters of Rebekah, I. O. O. F., and made an active and useful member. She filled the office of Secretary with marked proficiency, and at the time of her death was Vice Grandelect of the Lodge.

Mrs. Lubker was a lady of culture and refinement. She possessed a warm heart and was ever animated by generous impulses. By her gentle disposition and amiable manners she won the esteem of all with whom she became acquainted. As a wife and mother, she was devoted, faithful, loving and indulgent. She was never so happy as when in her home, surrounded by her husband and children. Language can not portray the anguish which pierces the heart of Mr. Lubker. As he gazes upon his three pretty little children, visions of wife and mother will rise up before him, and he will feel the very presence of her spirit, only to be followed by the piercing realization that he is left all alone to watch over those little ones, who thus early in life have been bereft of a mother's affectionate caresses and tender care.

The funeral of Mrs. Lubker took place on Friday afternoon. Her remains were taken to the Presbyterian Church, where the solemn and impressive rites of the Order of Daughters of Rebekah were performed, followed by an able discourse by Rev. L. L. Lorimor. After the services, the body was conveyed to the new cemetery and deposited in the tomb to await the resurrection morn.
