D. M. McKain Dies Of Heart Attack

D. M. McKain, one of Brownstown's most prominent business men and well known over the county, died at his home here this afternoon at 2 o'clock, from heart trouble.

He was at his place of business up to the noon hour, but had complained more or less this morning of his heart. Just before noon he was seized with a slight heart attack and was assisted to his home by E. M. Boss.

He seemed to feel better for a short time after reaching home but was again taken worse. Dr. Joe Cummings, who was summoned, saw that his condition was serious, and in the meantime word had been tele-

phoned to his son, Dr. Maurice McKain of Columbus, who started at once but did not reach here until after his father's death.

Several years ago Mr. McKain opened a grocery store in the Banner block, which is considered one of the most up-to-date grocery stores in the county. He enjoyed a lucrative business and was well-known throughout the county. Prior to going into business here, he was a traveling salesman for Hullman & Co., of Terre Haute a number of years.

He was a prominent member of the Methodist church and Sunday school and had been a member of the official board for many years.

David Morton McKain, son of Edward and Emily McKain, was born at Free-

town, Indiana, May 17, 1867.

On June 18, 1891, he was married to Miss Anna Allen of Brownstown and to their union were born one son, Dr. Maurice McKain, of Columbus, and one daughter, Mrs. Chas. Lucas, of Brownstown, who with their mother survive him.

Besides his widow and two children he is survived by seven grandchildren, three sisters, Mrs. Eunice Hudson and Mrs. Margaret Reedy of Freetown and Mrs. Mary Motsinger of Indianapolis and a half-brother, Stocker Wheeler, of Tulsa, Okla.

Funeral services will be held at the Methodist church, Brownstown, Rev. Leo Lovell officiating. The time of the services has not been set.
