

Mrs.F.M.Moore Expires At 82

Widow Of Rev. F. M. Moore, Former Pastor Of B'town Presbyterian Church.

Mrs. Luetta Hedges Moore, widow of the late F. M. Moore, age 82 years and 3 months, died at her home in Brownstown Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock. She had been in failing health for some time but was able to be up and about until about ten days ago, when she became bedfast.

Funeral services were conducted at the Presbyterian church, of which she was a member. Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock in charge of the pastor, the Rev. Robert W. Crosby. Burial in Pairwisey cemetery.

Mrs. Moore was born June 1, 1856, at Terre Haute, Ind, and was the enly child of Posey G. and Nancy E. Hedges. She was one of Brownstwin's most talented and refined women and possessed a personality which made her many friends. As long as her health permitted she was a regular attendant at church and Sunday school and for a number of years served as the church organist.

Mrs. Moore was educated in the city schools of Terre Haute. She received her musical training under Prof. Anton Shide and Prof. Baker of the Boston Conservatory of Music. She taught music in the Westfield, Illinois college and was a member of the faculty.

On March 20, 1884, she was married

to the Rev. F. M. Moore. To their union were born three children, Grace E. Moore Hall, who died December 25, 1915; Luetta Pearl, who died in infancy, and Karl F. Moore, of New York City.

Rev. Moore served as paster of the Brownstown Presbyterian church seven years moving here from Vincennes. From here they moved to Salem, where they resided until 1928, when they returned to Brownstown. Rev. Moore died June 1, 1928. After the death of Bev. Moore she moyed to the home of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Vahl. They became very much attached to her and she always referred to them as "my boy and girl."
