Mrs. N. H. Parker - Dies In Hospital —Rites Sunday

Mrs. Mabel A. Parker, 77, 724 West Fifth street, wife of Noble H. Parker, died at 10 p. m. Thursday in Schneck Memorial Hospital where she had been a patient since Saturday. She was hospitalized after being injured in a fall at home.

Prominent in civic and church groups, Mrs. Parker was a native and life-long resident of Jackson County. She was a 50-year member of Seymour Chapter No. 134, Order of the Eastern Star, past president of the Woman's Society of Christian Service at the First Methodist Church in Seymour,

the WSCS.
Mrs. Parker was born on October 9, 1885, at Brownstown, the daughter of the late Charles M. and Ida Whitson Allen, and was married on November 10, 1917, at New Albany to Noble H. Parker, who survives.

She and her husband lived in Brownstown until 1930 when they moved to Seymour. Mrs. Parker was an active member of the First Methodist Church in Seymour.

Besides her husband, she is survived by one daughter, Miss Evelyn Parker, at home, and one sister, Mrs. Walter Rheineck, El Dorado, Ark. One son, one brother and one sister preceded her in death.
