Rites Held Saturday For Noble H. Parker Ex-Local Resident

Funeral rites were held Saturday afternoon in Seymour First Methodist Church for Noble H. Parker, of that city, a former resident of Brownstown.

In failing health for several years, Mr. Parker died in the Jackson county hospital at 4:00 o'clock last Wednesday afternoon, just one month and one day after the death of his wife.

Mr. Parker, who had been a frequent patient in Bartholomew County Hospital, Columbus, during the past several years, was admitted to the Jackson county hospital in mid-April. The day following his admission, Mrs. Parker fell at her home, fracturing her hip and was taken to the hospital for treatment. She died there of complications on April 25.

Mr. Parker was able to return to his home late in April, but remained only three days when he suffered a relapse and was returned to the hospital. He underwent surgery Wednesday afternoon, and died soon after.

A native of Salem, he was born on July 6, 1895, a son of Oden F. Parker, still a resident of Salem and now 96 years old, and the late Martha Denny Parker.

He was married in New Albany, November 10, 1917, to Mabel Allen, and they were residents of Brownstown for a number of years.

Mr. Parker had been associated with the Prudential Insurance Company for thirty-five years, first as a debtor in Brownstown, then as manager of the Seymour office and later as a debtor in that city. Failing health forced

his retirement several years ago.

He was one of the key laymen of Seymour First Methodist Church, had served as church treasurer for over 20 years, was a deacon and a long-time member of the church finance committee.

He was a World War I veteran and a member of Washington Lodge No. 13, Free and Accepted Masons of Brownstown.

Surviving are a daughter, Miss Evelyn Parker, at home, and a sister, Mrs. Mabel Houston, of Salem. A son, who died in infancy, a brother and sister are deceased.

Funeral rites were in charge of the Rev. Charles A. Walls, pastor of Seymour First Methodist Church. Interment was in Fairview Cemetery here, with the Zabel Funeral Home in charge.
