PERRIN—Solomon Perrin died at his home in Brownstown Sunday evening, November 20, 1910, of double pneumonia. He had been sick only about ten days. Deceased was born in Washington county July 28, 1844, and came to Jackson county in 1876, where he has resided since, with the exception of a few years residence in the west. He was married three times, his first wife being a Miss Bison, of Illinois, who died just a year after their marriage. To their union was born one child which died in infancy. His second marriage was to Lide Miller, who preceded him to the grave some years ago. To this union were born three children, one dying in infancy, and two daughters, Rosa and Myrtle, are still living. His last marriage was to Letha Boling, who with one son survives him. He is also survived by one sister and three brothers, viz: Mrs. A. M. Vanover, and Andy Perrin, of this place; John Perrin, of Scott county, and Wm. Perrin, of Posey county. He was a veteran of the Civil War, having served in Co. G, 130th Regt. Ills. Vols. The funeral services were conducted at the residence Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock by Rev. Jesse Nichols, after which the remains were laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.
