Death of an Old Citizen.

Died.—Rezin A. Redman departed this life October 5th, 1889, at the residence of his daughter, Mrs. Frank Emerson, in Brownstown, Ind., aged 79 years and 20 days.

Mr. Redman was a native of Clark county, Indiana. He first came to Brownstown about the year 1826, and was for a number of years engaged in business here, first as a tailor and later engaged in the mercantile pursuits. He was the first elected auditor of Jackson county, and was re-elected to that office a number of times. In the year 1850 he removed to Iowa and resided there about ten years when he again returned to Brownstown, where he has ever since made his home.

By the death of Mr. Redman Brownstown loses one of her best citizens. Although having retired from business life several years ago, his earlier enterprises left an indelible influence to exert itself upon the business interests of this community. Prominent in educational interests and church circles, he has ever been a zealous advocate of all that would promote the interests of our people.

The death of such a man is a loss long to be felt and the surviving members of his family have the sympathy of the entire community. The funeral took place from the residence of his son-in-law, Frank Emerson, Tuesday afternoon at 1 o'clock.
