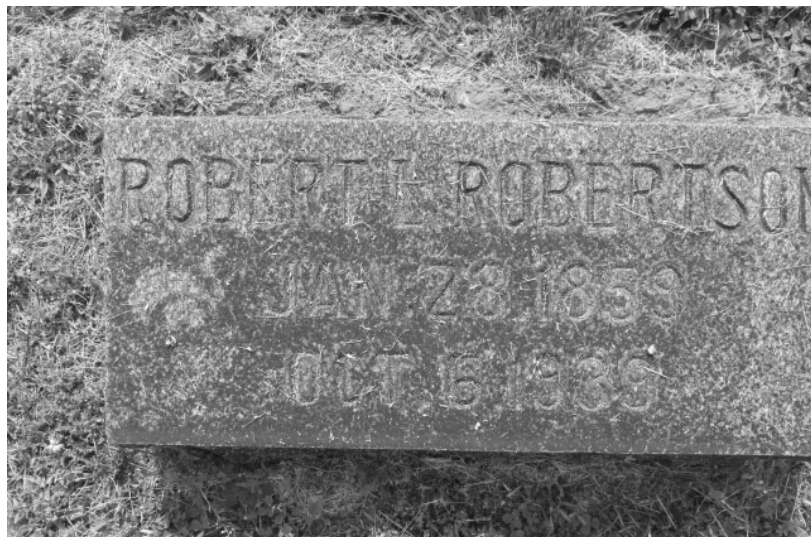

## R. L. Robertson Aged 80, Dies Suddenly

Leander Reedy, 79, Expires At  
Freetown...Other Deaths The  
Past Week.

Robert L. Robertson, age 80 years, one of Jackson county's well known and highly respected citizens, passed away at his home in Brownstown Saturday morning at 9 o'clock, following an illness of four weeks. Death was due to a heart attack.

Funeral services were conducted at the home Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock with the Rev. O. S. Brooke, Christian minister, and the Rev. J. R. Quick, pastor of the Baptist church, in charge. Burial in Fairview cemetery.

Mr. Robertson was the son of John B. and Mary Elizabeth Wayman Robertson and was born near Brownstown on what is known as the Eddie Robertson farm. He was married twice. On February 5, 1884, he was married at Newman, Ill., to Miss Kate Cash of Cherryville, Kansas. To their union were born five boys and one girl. They resided at Newman until 1888, when they returned to Brownstown. Mrs. Robertson preceded him in death September 22, 1916. On March 8, 1917, he was married to Miss Rose Durham of Brownstown who survives. He was a member of the Christian church.

Deceased was a farmer and miller by occupation. He had been highly successful in his enterprises and his

upright honest dealings had won for him a host of friends, who were grieved to learn of his death.

Besides his widow he is survived by four sons by his first marriage, Fred, of Seymour; Ward and Paul, of Columbus; Harry, of Kansas City Missouri; one brother, Bruce Robertson, of Madison; five grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.
