Ralph R. Rumph Dies At Daughter's Home

Ralph R. Rumph, 54, Freetown R1, died this morning at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Paul Taylor, 820 North Blish street. He had been ill for the past two years.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 o'clock Monday afternoon from the Voss Mortuary with the Rev. Amos S. Bastin, pastor of the First Methodist Church, in charge. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown. The Veterans of Foreign Wars will conduct military rites.

Friends may call at the Voss Mortuary after noon Sunday.

Mr. Rumph was born March 7, 1897, on a Brownstown rural route, the son of the late William T. and Eva Mae Stilwell Rumph. He spent his entire life in this county and was married in January, 1924, in Seymour to Edna Marie Rayl, who survives.

He had been a driver for the Gulf Refining Company until his health failed and was widely known throughout the county and vicinity. He was a veteran of World War I and was a member of the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Survivors include two children: William T. Rumph, serving with the U. S. Army at Camp Atterbury and Mrs. Paul Taylor, of Seymour; a granddaughter, Robin Lee Taylor, and four brothers: Louis G. Rumph, Freetown R1; Walter E. Rumph, Brownstown; Charles H. Rumph, Seymour R2 and Raymond L. Rumph, Cortland R1.
