STROKE RESULTS FATALLY FOR MAN

George Schwein, of Brownstown,
Dies Following Paralytic Stroke
Monday Afternoon.

WAS SUCCESSFUL FARMER

Leaves Widow And Six Children—
Funeral Wednesday Afternoon
at Family Residence.

George Schwein, aged 68 years and 25 days, died at his home near Brownstown this morning at 4:30 o'clock as the result of an attack of paralysis suffered at his home about 4 o'clock Monday afternoon. He did not regain consciousness following the stroke.

Mr. Schwein was one of the most prominent and successful farmers of the central part of the county. He was held in highest regard as a business man and christian citizen. Born in Brownstown township, he continued to reside there throughout life. He was a member of the Brownstown Presbyterian church, and the Odd Fellows lodge at Brownstown.

Surviving are the widow, two daughters and four sons, the daughters being Mrs. Minnie Woodmansee, of Brownstown, and Mrs. Elmer Kennedy, and the sons: Ed, Frank, Everett and Dewey, the former three at home. An only brother, Frank Schwein also survives. William Schwein, another brother, died within the last few months at Brownstown, he also having been a most successful farmer, and business man at Brownstown.

The funeral will be held Wednesday afternoon from the home with Rev. F. M. Moore, of the Brownstown Presbyterian church in charge, burial in Fairview cemetery there.
