CHARLES H. SCOTT SUCCUMBS SUDDENLY

TRAVELING MAN ILL SHORT TIME

Body to be Taken to Brownsville, Ind., for Rites on Wednesday

Charles H. Scott, 47, well known and highly esteemed Fremont and popular traveling man, died very suddenly at 5 o'clock this morning at his home, 208 south Arch street, after a short illness of pneumonia. Mr. Scott's condition had been regarded as very unsatisfactory by his physician and the trained nurse in attendance, and his death came as a great shock to his wife and those in attendance, besides his hosts of friends. Words of regret were heard from all sides, when the death of Mr. Scott became known.

The body will be taken to Brownstown, Ind., for the funeral and burial, leaving here Tuesday night, and the services are to be held at Brownstown Wednesday.

Charles Henry Scott was born in Brownstown, Ind., on July 30, 1881, and as a young man, was married to Miss Lily May Hogan of Sturgeon Bay, Wis., the wife who survives. His mother, Mrs. Hettie M. Scott of Indianapolis, Ind., is also living, together with four sisters and one brother, Mrs. Fred Cheyne, Mrs. Charles A. Bolles, Mrs. Loraine Osborne, Mrs. Florence Feldman, all of Indianapolis, Ind., and Hamlin Scott of Chicago. The brother will arrive in Fremont this evening.

Mr. and Mrs. Scott have resided in Fremont the last three years, Mr. Scott traveling for the F. Bissell Company of Toledo. He was a member of the Elks' lodge. Since coming to Fremont, Mr. and Mrs. Scott have been among the city's prominent residents and they have made hosts of friends here, who will mourn the death of Mr. Scott and extend their deepest sympathy to the bereaved wife.
