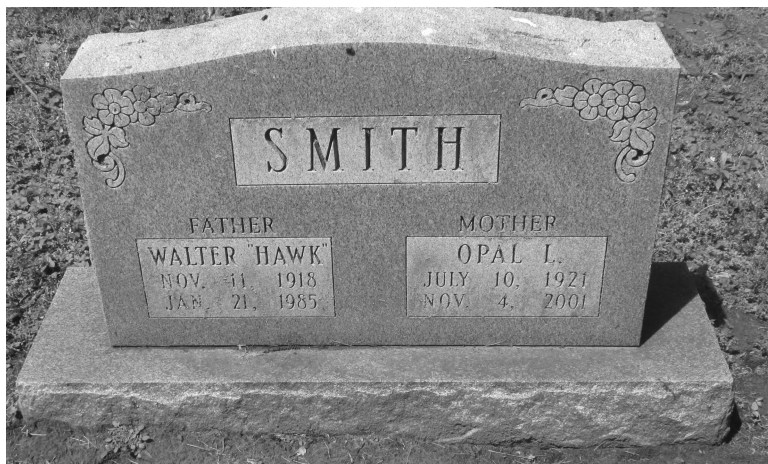

Walter "Hawk" Smith, 66, of 1012 W. Spring St. in Brownstown died at 12:25 p.m. Monday, Jan. 21, at the Jackson County Hospital. He had been ill five years.

He had been a foreman for the Brick and Tile Co. in Brownstown before working for the state highway department 15 years.

Funeral will begin at 1:30 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 24, at Winklepleck-Weesner Funeral Home in Brownstown. The Rev. Neal McCory will officiate. Burial will be at Fairview Cemetery in Brownstown.

Calling is scheduled from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. today, Wednesday, Jan. 23, and after 9 a.m. Thursday.

Mr. Smith was born Nov. 11, 1918, in Manchester, Ky., to Lloyd W. and Susie Proffitt Smith. He had lived in Jackson County 49 years. He married Opal Acton on May 20, 1939, in Brownstown and she survives.

Also surviving are one daughter, Mrs. Ron (Mary) Dixon of Brownstown; one brother, Clifton Gene Smith of Freetown; two sisters, Barbara Bean of Freetown and Irene Eglen of Seymour; two grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by two brothers and three sisters.

Mr. Smith served in the U.S. Army during World War II. He was a member of the Freetown Pentecostal Church.
