Moses Utterback.

In our last issue we briefly mentioned the death of Moses Utterback, another of Jackson county's time-honored citizens. His death occurred only about an hour before we went to press and we were unable to publish the following obituary until this week.

Moses Utterback was born in Shelby county, Kentucky, April 5th, 1825, and died at his home in Ewing, Ind., September 2nd, 1896, aged 71 years, 4 months and 27 days. His first wife was Mandy Reynolds to whom he was married in Franklin county, Kentucky. Further than their marriage we were unable to learn anything of the history of this union. In 1858 he was married to a Miss Samples, who preceded him to the grave about eight years ago. To them was born one son, Chas. M. Utterback, who survives them. In 1858 he moved to Washington county this state, where he remained until 1861, when he came to Jackson county. He moved to Brownstown in 1864 and 1866 located in Ewing where he continuously resided until his death. About a year ago he became afflicted with asthma and later with dropsy, which caused his death.

He was a blacksmith by occupation, and as such enjoyed a wide-spread acquaintance throughout the county. He was a life-long democrat, an active and earnest member of the I. O. O. F. Lodge, No. 488, of this place.

The funeral services were held Thursday, September 3rd, 1896, at the Christian church in Ewing, Elder G. M. Shutts officiating, after which the remains were taken in charge by Brownstown Lodge, No 488, I. O. O. F., and laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.
