—Due notice was made in our last issue of the sudden death of one of Brownstown's most estimable young men—James A. Vance, aged 22 years, 10 months and 10 days—which occurred on Tuesday evening at 5:45 o'clock. This young man had been of poor health for quite a number of years, and last winter he went to a pleasure and health resort in Wisconsin, where he sojourned for some time more for his health than anything else, and when he returned he had sent to him from that place a considerable amount of mineral water, which he thought was beneficial to his health. He seemed benefitted by the use of this mineral water, and his folks were rejoiced to see him looking apparently so well, and the week before his death he was certainly looking in better health than he had for months before. On Monday the 11th inst. he had a relapse. He went to bed but his folks were not seriously alarmed, and it was thought that he would soon be up and about again. However, at noon, on Tuesday, he grew rapidly worse and physicians were summoned. They pronounced the patient dangerously ill and remained at his bedside constantly until death came. The demise of Jas. A. Vance was a severe blow to the family, especially to Mrs. Vance, who is almost overcome with grief—this being the second son she has lost within a little over a year's time. The deceased was the son of Mr. and Mrs. D. B. Vance. He was born at Crothersville October 2, 1867, and about ten years ago removed with his parents to this place, where he has resided ever since. Of a family of four children only two remain to mourn the loss of their departed beloved brother. All the surviving members of the family were present when he died and did everything for him that loving hearts and willing hands could do. He was a good and loving young man, well-liked by all who knew him, and a large circle of friends mourn his loss. The funeral was held at the Presbyterian Church on Thursday, at 2 o'clock p. m., Rev. W. N. Fletcher preaching the funeral discourse, and was largely attended.
