WAYMAN—Mrs. America Wayman, wife of Edmond Wayman, died at her home in Brownstown, Friday morning, July 5, 1907, about 6 o'clock, aged 72 years, 6 months and 23 days. Her death was caused by a rare disease, known in the medical world as Addison's disease (a kidney trouble) with which she had been afflicted for some months past.

Deceased was born on what is known as the Weathers farm, on the Brownstown and Vallonia road, then owned by her father, John Weathers. She was united in marriage to Edmond Wayman, January 10, 1856. For about nine years they lived on a farm, moving to Brownstown about 1865, since which time they have lived in the same house where she died. To their union were born five children, three girls and two boys, only one of whom—Charles—together with the husband survives her. Mrs. Wayman was a member of the Christian church; she was a devoted wife, a good mother, a kind neighbor and a lover of home, seldom going away from her own fire-side.

Funeral services were held at the family residence, Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Eld. W. E. Payne, pastor of the Christian church, officiating, after which the remains were laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.

The aged companion, whose home is now broken in his declining years, together with the other relatives, have the sympathy of many friends.
