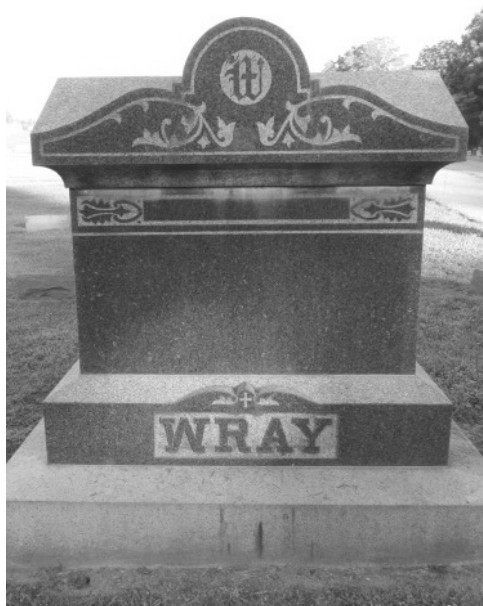

DEATH SUMMONS AGED RESIDENT

Mrs. Susan Wray, 95, Dies at Her Home at Norman Thursday.

FUNERAL RITES SUNDAY

Mrs. Susan Wray, age ninety-five, one of Jackson county's oldest residents, died Thursday at the home following an illness of two weeks' duration with intestinal influenza.

Funeral services will be conducted at 11 o'clock Sunday morning from the residence at Norman. Burial in the Brownstown Cemetery.

Mrs. Wray was a native of Vienna, Scott county, where she was born on October 28, 1843, the daughter of Kiah Sutton. She had observed her ninety-fifth birthday twenty-seven days ago.

Mrs. Wray was married on December 20, 1861, at Louisville, Ky., to Oregon Wray. She had spent the greater part of her life in Jackson county. She was a member of the Baptist Church at Guthrie Creek and was well known throughout the western part of the county. Many friends mourn her death.

Two children, Newton Wray, and Mrs. Florence Pfaffenberger, preceded their mother in death. She is survived by three children, James Wray, of Brownstown; Mrs. Flora Dodds, of Lafayette and Roy Wray, of Davis, California.

Also surviving are two brothers and one sister, Robert Sutton, of Kurtz; Mrs. Rachel Wienninger, of Kurtz, and George Sutton, of Freetown.
