Body Brought Here

Wife Was Miss Mae Shelton, Formerly of Brownstown, Now Deceased.

The remains of George Elliott, aged 40, were brought to Brownstown Thursday for burial by the side of his wife in Fairview cemetery.

He was fatally injured Tuesday afternoon while working at the plant of the National Grain Elevator Co., in Indianapolis, which was recently destroyed by fire.

He was shoveling coal when an iron beam or post fell striking him across the forehead, inflicting injuries which resulted in his death in about five hours. He had been employed at the place only a short time.

The elevator was burned June 19, with an estimated loss of about \$200,-000. Elliott was employed by farmers who had the contract to salvage oats.

Deceased lived in Brownstown for a year or more some years ago. His wife was formerly Miss Mae Shelton, daughter of Mary Shelton Burrell, of Brownstown. Mrs. Eliott died about five years ago. They are survived by one daughter, Miss Dorsie Elliott, who lives with her aunt, Mrs. Maude Adams at Louisville.
