LONG—Mrs. Lorena May Long, widow of the late Capt. B. E. Long, died at her home at this place Monday night, October 11, 1915, of cancer, aged 45 years, 8 months and 24 days.

Deceased had been in failing health for more than a year. On July 13, 1914, she went to Indianapolis where she underwent an operation at the Long Memorial Hospital. After returning home she seemed better and was able to be about. But in the early spring she began to suffer again and returned to the hospital where she underwent another operation July 17, 1915, since which time she gradually grew worse and for the past two months her sufferings have been intense.

She was born at Medora, Ind., January 17, 1870, but spent the greater part of her life in Brownstown. She was twice married. First to Walter A. Findley March 24, 1889. To their union was born one daughter, Mrs. Faith Weddell. She was again united in marriage to Capt. B. E. Long, September 20, 1905, who preceded her to the grave October 24, 1913. One daughter was born to this union, Beulah, aged about eight years.

She united with the Methodist church at this place when about fourteen years of age and remained a member until death. She was a devoted mother and a good kind neighbor and was willing to help those who needed assistance. Besides her two daughters she leaves two sisters and one brother, Mrs. Anna Fislar, of Vallonia, Mrs. Mollie Groover, of Elwood, and Robert Loudon, of this place. She also leaves a step-mother, Mrs. Margaret Loudon, whom she loved as an own mother; three half-sisters, and two half brothers, viz: Mrs. May Stout, Mrs. Kate Graham, and Guy Loudon, of this place, and Mrs. Maude Lane and Walter Loudon, of Indianapolis. While she will be greatly missed by all, none will miss her more than her daughter, Mrs. Weddell, who has so patiently and tenderly cared for her during her last sickness.

The funeral services will be conducted at the M. E. church Thursday afternoon at two o'clock by Rev. C. N. Willson, followed by interment in Fairview cemetery.
