Death has again entered our midst and taken from us one who was loved and esteemed by a large circle of friends, relatives and acquaintances. Mrs. Isabell Robertson, wife of Charles A. Robertson, breathed her last about 9 o'clock Thursday morning, December 30th; 1897, aged 52 years, 9 months and 19 days. The cause of her death was compaction of the bowels, and though her illness was of only two weeks duration, yet her sufferings were intense, but with her family and friends ever ready to minister with tender love to her wants, she bore her afflictions with christian fortitude. Her faithful companion was constantly at her side, with words of cheer on his lips, but deepest grief in his heart, as he realized that Death was hovering near. The best of medical skill and all that loving hands could do, had not the power to stay the final summons of Him who was tenderly calling her to her eternal home.

Mrs. Robertson was a woman of pure, generous and noble character. She was noted for her peculiar tranquility of disposition, and a gentleman who has been intimately related to the Robertson family for the past thirty years, was heard to remark just a few days prior to her recent illness that he had never in all his accquaintance with her, seen her in ill humor or her temper ruffled in the least. Kind and generous to a fault, possessed of undying devotion to her husband and children, her chief desire seeming to be to contribute to their comfort and welfare.

Isabell E. Gosslee was born near London, Ohio, March 11th, 1845, and became a member of the M. E. Church early in life. She was united in marriage to Charles A. Robertson September 7th, 1869. To them were born seven children, four boys and three girls, six of whom-four boys and two girlsare still living, viz: Dunham, Edmond and Chas.
