CALLED TO MEMPHIS:

BROTHER IN ACCIDENT
J. C. Snyder, one of the proprietors
of The Leader, was called to Memphis
late Sunday, on account of the serious
injury of his brother in an auto accident there, and the death of his brother's wife frm injuries received. An accaunt of the tragedy was in Monday's
Commercial Appeal. The account follows, in part:

"Mrs. Ernestina Snyder, wife of W. A. Snyder of 406 Harvard Street, Binghamton, was killed instantly at 1 o'clock yesterday afternoon when the automobile in which she was a passenger turned over and rolled down a 30 foot embankment near the Noncountal bridge, eight miles south of the city.

"Mr. Snyder, her husband; Miss Faye Calvert, 305 Oxford Sreet, Binghanton, and Miss Genevieve Kelson of Summer Avenue, Binghanton, were also in the car but escaped with more or less serious injuries. Mr. Snyder's right leg was hurt badly at the knee, and Miss Calvert sustained a broken arm and dislocated shoulder. Miss Kelsoe was bruised only slightly.

"Mr. Snyder was driving the auto and Miss Calvert was on the front seat with him. Mrs. Snyder and Miss Kelsoe occupied the rear seat. Mr. Snyder tried to dodge a hole in the road and in doing so his auto went over the edge of the embankment. The car rolled down fully 50 feet and turned over three times.

"The two young women and Mr. Snyder were thrown out of the car, but Mrs. Snyder was pinioned under it. Her face was badly iscerated, her head crushed and probably her neck was broken. It is believed that she was killed instantly."
